THE BOARD having examined and compared the Regimental Records, the Soldier's Book, and such other Documents as appeared to them to be necessary, report that

Henry Truelock by Trade a Laborer was BORN in the Parish of Celbridge in or near the Town of Celbridge in the County of Kildare and was ATTESTED for the Royal Regiment of Artillery at Dublin in the County of Dublin on the 24th Novemr. 1840 at the Age of 20 1/2 years that after making every Deduction required by Her Majesty's Regulations, the SERVICE up to this day, which he is entitled to reckon, amounts to 22 years, 179/163 days, as shewn by the detailed Statement on the 2nd page; during which period, he served Abroad 6 1/2 years, viz. —

at Iona Scotia 5 1/2 years,
in Crimia 1 1/2 years;

and further, that his DISCHARGE is proposed in consequence of his having

With regard to the CHARACTER AND CONDUCT of Corporal Henry Truelock the Board have to report, that upon reference to the Defaulter's Book, and by the Parole testimony that has been given, it appears that his Conduct

has been Exemplary.
He is in possession of five Good Conduct Badges and wears a Medal for Service in the Crimea with a clasp for Sebastopol, also a Turkish War Medal. He has been awarded a Silver Medal for Long Service and Good Conduct and a Gratuity of £5—
He has never been convicted by Court Martial and his name is not recorded in the Regimental Defaulter's Book.
