
TRULOCK & HARRISS,

THE old and well-known firm of TRULOCK AND HARRISS, which holds the Viceroy's Appointment, was founded over a century ago by W. Trulock, deceased some sixty years back. The founder subsequently associated his son-in-law, Mr. Harriss, with him in the business under the title now borne. Sixteen years ago Mr. Harriss died, and the business has since been carried on by his son, Mr. John Harriss, the present sole proprietor. The premises contain a fine warehouse to the front and large workshops to the rear, where a great number of expert hands are employed, aided by the best modern appliances. In the warehouse may be seen, in glass cases on the walls and in the centre of the showroom, every variety of rifled, choke, cylinder and repeating weapons, revolvers of various types, and sporting and

shooting accessories. Besides fitting their numerous private patrons with guns, the firm are contractors to the Royal Irish Constabulary, are large exporters to all parts of the world, and especially to India and the East. It is superfluous to say that their productions are recognized as second to none, and that the name of the firm has long been regarded as a guarantee of all that is excellent and reliable in guns, rifles, and revolvers.

An interesting feature is their "try gun," which is the only firing one in Ireland. At their range at Lansdowne Road a very pleasant morning may be spent, fitted up as it is with all sorts of artificial targets, disappearing birds, moving targets, running rabbits, and the latest addition—a patent shooting-practice snipe, which is an admirable device and very natural in its flight.
