Box of deeds, copy deeds, correspondence, etc, all relating to the marriage (1843) of Arthur Brooke Cooper II (d.1845) and Elizabeth Trulock, including a draft and the original of his parents' marriage settlement (1810) and a copy of the will (1844) of her father (d.1847), the Rev. George Trulock, Rector of Skreen [near Coopershill].

These deeds, and related papers, relate to the position of Catherine Jane Cooper, only child of Arthur Brooke Cooper II and Elizabeth Trulock (who died in 1849 [except that Burke's Landed Gentry of Ireland, 1904, says 1859]), and in particular to Catherine Jane's claims on the Cooper of Coopershill estate following the early deaths of her parents and the succession of her father's younger brother, Charles William Cooper, later O'Hara, [BLG, 1904, states that Catherine Jane Cooper married J. Cole, but who or what he was is not documented by the Coopershill archive.] Included in the bundle is a list of relevant deeds, as follows: 'Original deed of settlement dated 2 January 1810, on the intermarriage of Arthur Brooke Cooper I with Miss Jane [Frances] O'Hara; original deed of consent, dated 23 December 1786, for [the] act of parliament [of 1788] for [the] sale of Arthur Cooper's estate [in 1791] ...; brief in the Chancery cause of "Cooper v Cooper" [in relation to Miss Catherine Jane Cooper's affairs] ..., 1855; ... attested copy [of] ... decretal order in the said cause, dated 11 July 1855; ... instructions laid before Robert W. Shekleton on 20 August 1870 to prepare [a] release from Miss Catherine Jane Cooper to her uncle, Charles William O'Hara Esq. ...', etc. This release of 1870 relates to a compromise, whereby Catherine Jane Cooper accepted a sum of £1,000 from Charles William Cooper in discharge and satisfaction of her claim against the lands of Kincrevin, Co. Sligo, arising from the imprecise wording of the marriage settlement of 1810. Also included in this three-quarters full box is a deed of 1870 by which Charles William O'Hara settles [his mother, Mrs] Jane Frances Cooper's (then of Somerton, Co. Sligo), claims on the estate.
